The Calaveras Child Care Council sits under the umbrella of The Resource Connection, and **Linda Mariani** is one of The Resource Connection's Board of Directors. We are proud to highlight her in our newsletter this month!

Mountain Oaks School opened it's first location in a small two-bedroom house in San Andreas in 1994, with 38 total students. Since then, Mountain Oaks received its official designation of Charter School #527 in 2003, and has grown substantially. Today Mountain Oaks, under the direction of the Calaveras County Office of Education (CCOE), serves approximately 400 students in the contiguous counties of Alpine, Amador, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Tuolumne.

In December **The Founders Day celebration** was held, to honor the original founders of the school Linda Mariani and Nancy Stehura, alongside former CCOE Superintendent Bob Bach (pictured on the right... Linda in green shirt).

A commemorative plaque located on a large boulder in front of the gymnasium, and a Trident Maple tree planted in the quad honor the school's beginning. The maple tree was generously donated by Don Urbanus of Rising Sun Nursery.

Congratulations to Linda and all Founders of Mountain Oaks, for creating a vision that has stood strong for so many decades!



CHILD 1: CHILD GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT: 3 units, Thursdays 1:00 – 4:05 pm or Fully Online Late Start Option Begins 2/26 – 4/19
Examines the major physical, psychosocial, and cognitive/language developmental milestones, both typical and atypical, from conception through adolescence. CSU and UC transferable.

CHILD 4: OBSERVATION AND ASSESSMENT: 3 units, Fully Online
Introduces assessment and observation tools and strategies to document young children's development and learning. Recording strategies, rating systems, portfolios, and other assessment tools will be discussed, along with strategies for collaboration. CSU transferable.

CHILD 22: CHILD, FAMILY, AND COMMUNITY: 3 units, Wednesdays 6:00 – 9:05 pm
Explores the processes of socialization focusing on the interrelationship of family, school, and community while examining the influence of multiple societal contexts. Students explore the role of collaboration between family, community, and schools in supporting children's development, birth through adolescence. CSU Transferable

CHILD 26: HEALTH, SAFETY, AND NUTRITION: 3 units, Fully Online.
This course explores laws, regulations, standards, policies, procedures, and best practices related to health, safety, and nutrition in care and education settings for children birth through middle childhood. Prevention strategies, nutrition and meal planning, integrating health/safety experiences into daily routine. CSU Transferable

CHILD 35: INTRODUCTION TO CURRICULUM 3 units, Fully Online.
Explores developmentally appropriate curriculum and environments for children birth through age eight. Students will use knowledge of children's development, theories of learning and development, and examples from various models of developmentally appropriate practice to plan environments and curriculum to support children's development and learning integrated throughout indoor and outdoor settings. CSU transferable

CHILD 36: TEACHING IN A DIVERSE SOCIETY: 3 units, Fully Online.
Examines the impact of various societal influences on the development of children's social identity. Examination of culturally relevant and linguistically appropriate anti-bias approaches supporting all children.

Keeping Kids Safe on Calaveras Roads:
2023 Child Passenger Safety Study

PRESS RELEASE from Calaveras County Public Health: Keeping Kids Safe on Calaveras Roads, 2023 Child Passenger Safety Study

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To better understand the local child safety practices, **Calaveras County Public Health (CCPH) conducted a field observation study at five local elementary and middle schools which**

assessed child restraint practices at school pick-ups in the Spring of 2023.

Nearly 4 out of 5 children in the study were not safely secured in vehicles. The top concerns found by the team were:

- In nearly 30% of vehicles observed, no safety restraints were used.
- Among 28% of vehicles observed, the vehicle pulled away without ensuring that the door was closed and the child was properly restrained.
- A booster or car seat was not used in 20% of observed vehicles where it would have been appropriate.





Background on Implementation of UPK Mixed Delivery

The California Department of Education (CDE) was directed by the Legislature in 2022 to convene the **statewide Universal Prekindergarten (UPK) Mixed Delivery Quality and Access Workgroup**, with the below mentioned statutory charge ([Education Code \(EC\) 8202.6](#)) and was given subsequent definitions to create parameters for what would come under the Workgroup's purview.

1. Provide recommendations on best practices for increasing access to high-quality universal preschool programs for three- and four-year-old children offered through a mixed-delivery model, that provides equitable learning experiences across a variety of settings.
2. Provide recommendations to update preschool standards pursuant to [California Education Code \(EC\) 8203](#) to support equitable access to high-quality preschool and Transitional Kindergarten (TK) programs, through the mixed delivery model and across all appropriate settings and funding sources.

3. Ensure that recommendations are in alignment with the work of the Master Plan for Early Learning and Care, without recommending new system changes that create increased state or local costs to offer preschool across the mixed-delivery system.

The **UPK Workgroup Consolidated Report** has recently been completed and released by this UPK Mixed Delivery Quality and Access Workgroup. The report is posted on the California Educators Together (CET) website, and can be viewed here [**UPK Workgroup Consolidated Report.**](#)




