STEP BY STEP LEGO PLANTERS



Grass Hair Pots

Step 1. Paint a couple of pots with white paint. I also went about an inch down on the inside of the pots. Decorate faces using paint and a sharpie for the hair details.

Step 2. Fill the pots up with soil and plant your seeds. Grass, spelt, wheat, rye or cat grass seeds are great options.

Step 3. Water and wait for the "hair" to grow.

Step 4. Allow kids to cut hair again and again!


Ideas for Outdoor Learning Opportunities



We love this unique way to re-use cardboard! Cut nature-inspired shapes out of a piece of cardboard, decorate around the edges, and use it in all types of ways! See photo for inspiration, or come up with your own ideas... don't forget that even the youngest learners can enjoy and benefit from this fun activity!

Spring is the perfect time to breathe in the fresh air and let the forest work its magic! "Forest Bathing," inspired by the Japanese practice of Shinrin-Yoku, goes beyond a simple walk in the woods. It's about connecting with nature through your senses, reducing stress, and improving your overall health.

Scientific studies suggest benefits like:
Lower stress and anxiety
Improved mood and emotional well-being
Boosted immune function
Enhanced cognitive function



Even if you live in town, you can reap the rewards! Calaveras County is filled with green spaces and countryside... visit your local park, or take a walk on the backroads to explore and absorb the benefits of being out in the fresh air. To register for Kindergarten, student must be 5 years old on or before September 1, 2024. To register for Transitional Kindergarten student must be 5 years old between September 2, 2024 and June 2, 2025.

The following documents are required for registration:

1. Birth Certificate
2. Proof of Residence (Utility bill, rental agreement, etc.)
3. Current Immunization Records
4. Proof of Physical Exam


Transitional Kindergarten (TK) will soon be available to all 4-year-olds in California. Your child can start Transitional Kindergarten (TK) at the beginning of the school year with the following birth dates:



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Exciting news! The **updated Preschool Learning Foundations** are set to release in summer 2024 — their most significant update since 2008. These Foundations are California's early learning standards for children ages 3 to 5 1/2 in center-based preschool, home-based preschool, and Transitional Kindergarten (TK) settings. In 2021, the California Department of Education (CDE) was provided one-time funding to update these Foundations to incorporate recent research in child development. These changes are the result of a thoughtful, multi-year process involving interest holder meetings and public input.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Affecting the Early Learning & Child Care Field

Exciting news for aspiring early childhood educators in California!

The Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) recently introduced the **PK-3 Early Childhood Education (ECE) Specialist Instruction Credential**, a credential designed for those passionate about teaching young children. Focused on developmentally appropriate practices, this credential will empower teachers to engage students based on their developmental levels, fostering joyful learning that prioritizes each child's cognitive, social, emotional, linguistic, and cultural experiences, creating an inclusive and enriching educational environment. The regulations for the PK-3 Early Childhood Education ECE Specialist Instruction credential were just approved by the Office of Administrative Law on February 7, 2024, and will be effective April 1, 2024.


