

## WHAT'S NEW

Ideas for Outdoor Learning Opportunities

### BUTTERFLY PUDDLE CRAFT


- Create a butterfly puddle station by decorating a shallow dish with bright colors, then filling it with small pebbles, sand, and a bit of water mixed with a pinch of salt or sugar. Place it in a sunny garden spot near flowers to attract butterflies. Kids can observe and record the butterflies that visit, combining creativity with nature learning!



### HOMEMADE SUNDIAL

- To make a homemade sundial, place a stick (gnomon) upright in the center of a paper plate or a flat surface outdoors in a sunny spot. Mark where the shadow falls at each hour using small rocks, chalk, or marker lines. Label the hours as the day goes on. By the end of the day, the sundial will show how the sun moves across the sky, teaching kids about time and Earth's rotation!





- Gardening is great for kids because it teaches responsibility, patience, and where food comes from while encouraging outdoor play and curiosity about nature. It also helps develop fine motor skills and a sense of accomplishment as they watch their plants grow! ## Legislative Updates Affecting the Early Learning & Child Care Field



- The California Department of Social Services (CDSS) has issued [Provider Information Notice \(PIN\) 25-01-CCP](#), summarizing newly enacted legislation affecting child care facilities. These laws, primarily effective January 1, 2025, introduce key regulatory changes for child care providers.

- [AB 318](#), introduced by Assemblymember Juan Alanis, aims to streamline California's child care licensing process. By 2027, the bill requires the Department of Social Services to accept electronic applications and credit card payments, while also allowing checks for fees. These changes seek to modernize and simplify licensing for child care providers.

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# Trainer Certification

**Approximately half of all U.S. children under the age of three have a regular child care arrangement creating a significant need for high-quality, responsive care.**

PITC builds capacity to improve high-quality infant and toddler care through engaging professional development in the following areas:

- ✦ Social-Emotional Growth & Socialization

The goal of PITC remains constant: to help infant and toddler care teachers and providers recognize and implement crucially important relationship-based practices and design care environments that are responsive to infants, toddlers, and their families.

## PITC Trainer Certification

The Trainer Institute features a blend of engaging virtual sessions with faculty and online learning experiences with a community of peers.

### In 2025-26

- ✦ 30-minute pre-enrollment orientation
- ✦ Exploration of a topic on the online platform during the launch week to facilitate the development of a certification activity with the support of your peers and your facilitator
- ✦ One facilitated 2-hour Learning Experience Plan session (with multiple times to choose from)
- ✦ 90-minute optional module opening sessions to highlight resources, climate of care, and training strategies for each module
